It will be a pleasure to welcome the 2020 Plone Conference in the City of Namur.

Visions and Goals

During the past few years, many changes have marked Plone (Python 3, Zope 4, Volto, ...). Given the major changes that the roadmap implies for Plone 6, it seems important to us that the annual conference be one of the moments to share recent changes with as many people as possible. We will emphasize this sharing in the choice of presentations, training and sprinting. It is also an opportunity to give to the world a vision of Plone's future.

Belgium and its entities share a long history with Plone, this will be an opportunity to invite local actors who have few or no occas to meet the Plone community.

As the number of participants in the annual Plone conference has declined slightly in recent years, one of this year's objectives will be to try to reverse the trend by attracting new participants. For this reason, it seems essential to us that for each period there is at least one presentation for each type of audience (developer, integrator, decision-maker). We are also thinking about alternative tracks to attract a different audience. The collaboration with the University of Namur for training and sprint will also be an opportunity to invite students to come and discover Plone.

To achieve these various objectives, our intention is to be able to mobilize the Belgian Plone community to offer the best possible experience to the participants of the Plone Conference 2020.

Capital of the Walloon region of Belgium, Namur has succeeded in preserving the traces of its rich past. Standing at the confluence of the Sambre and the Meuse rivers, the majestic Citadel overlooks the city. Together, they have passed through many ages.

Accessibility

The city of Namur nestled in a set of greenery at the confluence of two rivers is situated only a stone's throw from Brussels, its international airport (BRU) and high-speed railway station (Brussels South).

The city of Namur is therefore easily accessible from all major European cities through daily connections operated as well by classic as low-cost companies.

Brussels International Airport (BRU) Distance from Namur city-centre: 67km – 45 min. Car rental station, railway station, taxi directly at the airport.
