

University of Cádiz and Free Software

The province of Cadiz is found framed in the autonomous region of Andalusia, in a very favorable political context for development of free software. The Junta de Andalucía local government of our region, published in March of 2003 an " **Decree for free software development and how to promote the information technologies**" that contemplates multiple initiatives destined to that our region advanced toward a society alphabetized technologically, dedicating specific resources to multiple environments, among them the educational one. Hundreds of schools and public institutes count already with computers in the classrooms, one for each two students, all it articulated by means of the use of **free software**.

In this context, the Universidad de Cádiz is found currently among the pioneering public institutions that bets on the free software in Spain. The Counsel of Government of the Universidad de Cádiz, maximum organ responsible for establishing its programmatic and strategic guidelines, approved in March of 2004 a statement supporting free software, this statement also recognized free software as a way to reach its fundamental and strategic lines. The decree drew an ambitious plan of intentions and, with that purpose, agreed the creation of the Office of Free Software of the University of Cadiz (OSLUCA) (<http://softwarelibre.uca.es>), fit inside the environment of the General Direction of Technologies of the Information.

From that moment, the OSLUCA has carried out numerous initiatives, among which the following are found:

- Organization of talks conferences and days, the most noticeable one of which was, given by **Richard M. Stallman** in July of 2003. The I and II Days of Free Software of the University of Cadiz and the IV Andalusian Days of Free Software (November of 2004).
- Promotion of the platform Zope + Plone for web developments and content management, we have already a portal running with plone+zope (<http://opam.org.es>) and at this moment we are working on our University portal based on zope + plone, the idea is migrate progressively all our portals to plone.
- Writing of a " Regulation for the exchange of institutional information ", approved institutionally by the Council of Government of the University of Cadiz in September, 2004, which establishes the obligation to use open formats as standard for the exchange of official information in our university.
- Putting on the verge an operating system based on GNU/Linux "Guadalinux_UCA", realized as fruit of the collaboration with the Junta of Andalusia, in order to facilitate free operating system to the persons who are part of our University.
- Impulse the use of free software in the teaching: installation in the classrooms of computer science Guadalinux_UCA and diffusion between the pupils, supporting the teachers of the University of Cadiz who decide to use free software for his teaching.

Certainly, the relation between free software and the **University of Cadiz** (<http://www.uca.es>) has ahead an interesting horizon. Free software will have every time a major presence in our University to foment the role of the University of Cadiz in the society as a source of knowledge and innovation, to favor the development of the local software industry (and precisely some Andalusian companies have given services of software developments and consultancy in Zope+Plone inside our University) and to advance towards the technological legality, the independence and not subordination.

Localization

Jerez de la Frontera is located in the province of Cadiz belonging to the Andalusian autonomous region of Spain. It is placed in the southwestern European end, in the coast of the Atlantic Ocean. For his geographical situation, it has an intermediate climate between the Mediterranean and the European Atlantic Ocean, with an annual average temperature of 18,1°C., it has an average of 74 annual days of rain, an entire absence of snowfalls and a wind strongly moderated. Cádiz bordering with the provinces of Seville, Huelva and Málaga, is nailed in the Bay of the same name, composed by cities : San Fernando's, Puerto Real, Chiclana, El Puerto de Santa Maria and Cádiz. East area, with a surface of 592 km² and a population of 402.256 inhabitants, is an important industrial, tourist and commercial axis of Andalusia.





In this context, the physical place of Cadiz frames his great natural characteristic: she is bathed completely in his perimeter by the sea, except in the south-east end in which there is reached the peninsula that forms in his union with San Fernando. **Jerez** is in the interior at 26 km of Cadiz.

The conference will be celebrated in the **Campus of the Asuncion**, placed in the center of the city of **Jerez**. This completely new Campus is located in the zone known as **La Asuncion**, in the city of **Jerez**. This area places in the East of the urban nucleus of **Jerez**.

The campus has an entire surface of approximately 114.000 m², of which approximately the fourth part have been destined for green zone, being the same perfectly provided with all the urban services.

With regard to the possibilities of local and metropolitan communication, it is convenient to emphasize that the accessibility and the mobility have been prior aspects born in mind at the moment of designing this model of university implantation.

The wonderful and privileged place where the Campus of the Asuncion of the University of Cadiz, is placed together with his facilities adapted to the needs, not only teachers, but also cultural and scientific, will allow to possess sufficient means in order that the activity to develop during the conference should be realized by the biggest possible serviceability.

The campus of the Asuncion is directly communicated with the road network of the city and, therefore, with the Metropolitan Network which connects with the national highways.

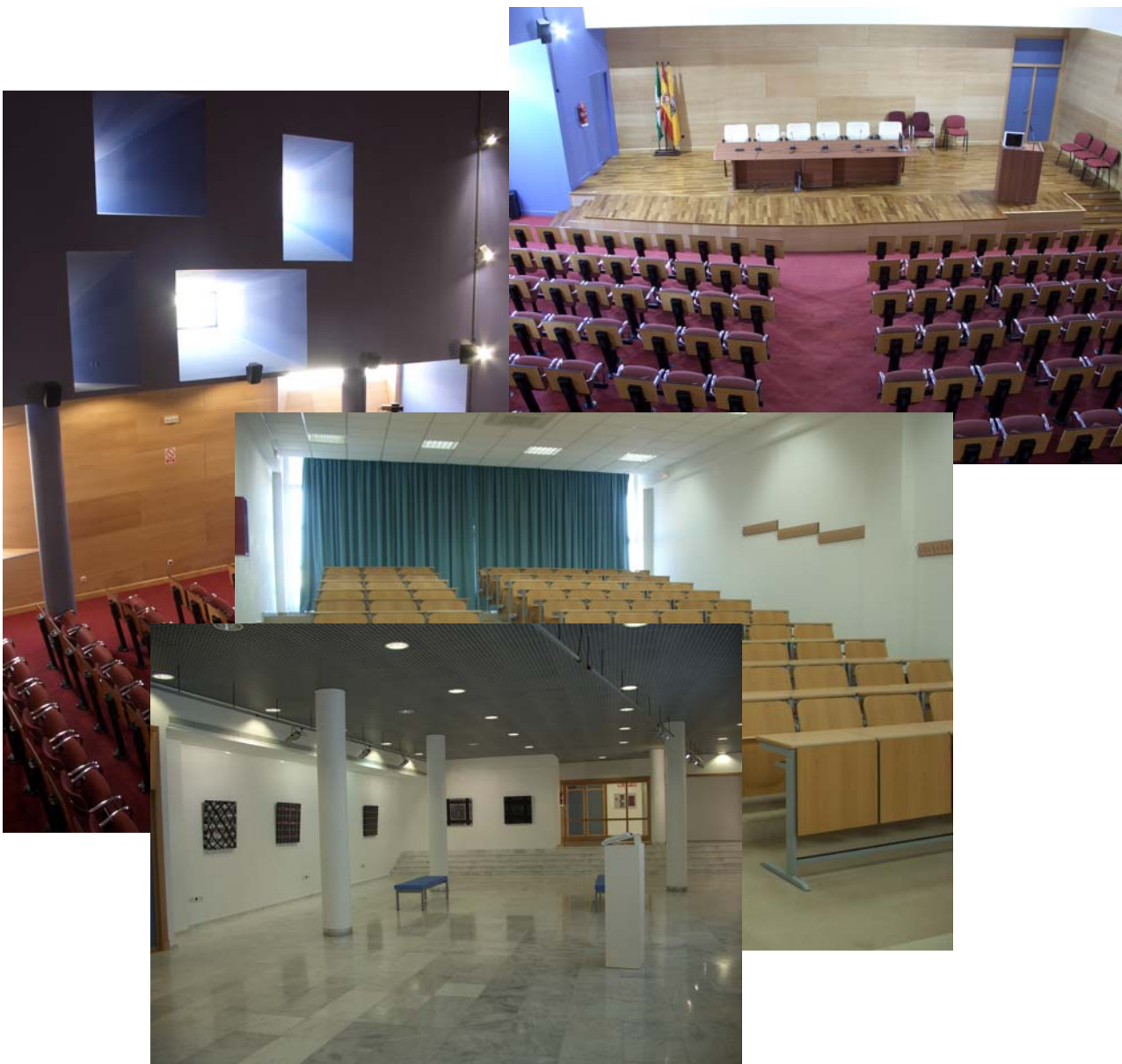
The whole Campus has installation of air conditioning and heating, being, besides, perfectly equipped to attend the needs of the disabled ones with ramps of access, elevators, cleaning and special seats.

All the classrooms they have microphone system, a system of videoprojection and sound that allows the presentation of papers and contents, and include computer support to the class, with a computer in the table of the teacher with connection to Internet.

Separate mention deserves the classroom of distance learning. Who has quality broadcast cameras that allows the postproduction of videos as well as the creation of contents of different formats for

distribution, videoprojector, robotised cameras, video, screen of projection, microphone system, sound system, videoconference system, are some of his numerous services.

The lounge of acts with capacity for 210 persons contains technological innovations that turns it into a great classroom of last generation. It possesses robotised cameras, video edition systems, systems of visualization of texts and diffusion of activities of the room across local area network and the internet on high quality, and it incorporates in every armchair, a system of connection for PDA'S and portable computers. Besides we arrange of more classrooms and enclosures for celebration of parallel acts, therefore at first we might locate more than 500 assistants.

Information about The city of Jerez, Climate, Acommodation, Transport
